# Nine Top Tips to Green your Business...



#### Install LEDs

LED lights cost less and last longer than fluorescent and halogen lighting.
They reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
There is no downside.



#### Identify energy users and manage

Measure the units of energy consumed by each piece of equipment on-site so that you can assign a cost to each user. Turn them off, turn them down, turn them in.



#### Go Renewable

Renewable energy combats climate change and costs less in the long run. Grant incentives for renewables are on the increase so watch this space!



#### Use The right bin

Good segregation of recyclable waste and food waste from general waste can significantly reduce your waste costs.



#### **Design out disposables**

Disposable materials can be convenient, but they are costly and a waste of the planet's limited resources. Use alternatives to disposable coffee cups, water cups, hand towels, packaging etc.



## Source sustainable raw materials and goods

Sustainable sourcing = Sustainable Business. Establish a Green Procurement Policy for your business.



#### Identify and fix water leaks

Undetected leaks are commonplace and could be costing your business thousands of euros. Find and monitor your water meter to check for leaks.



#### **Control urinals**

Water used by a urinal typically costs €800/annum whether occupied or not. Use sensors to control water use and reduce costs.



#### Reduce the flow

Measure and reduce flow rates from taps, showers and hoses. Taps with flow rates of 4 litres per minute are fine. One can have a good shower with a flow rate of 7 litres per minute.
